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Foreword

Since its inception, the Institute of Population Health has nurtured interdisciplinary research into complex interactions that determine the health of individuals, communities and global populations. Even a cursory glance of the output of Principal Scientists associated with the Institute reveals the impressive scope of determinants that are being studied, including biological, social, cultural, psychological and environmental factors. Intervention research has steadily increased. Furthermore, knowledge arising from research conducted under the auspices of the Institute of Population Health already has been applied in decision-making at many different levels including macro-policy, institutional policy, health programs and individual behaviour.

Creation of the Institute of Population Health enabled research foci to be identified and accelerated by Principal Scientists in a diverse suite of population and public health priorities. Opportunities to accelerate interdisciplinarity remain highly dependent on availability and resources of Principal Scientists themselves. To build Canadian research capacity in population health, more opportunities for graduate students, postdoctoral fellows, Research Fellows and other early- to mid-career positions are needed. This year, there was greater realization that, as the Institute does not administer graduate programs, it does not meet the criteria for an Institute at the University. There also was a determination to redress the relative lack of visibility within the University of much of the activity undertaken by Principal Scientists and their value as untapped resources as teachers, research collaborators and mentors in population health. In addition, formal external partnerships necessary to deliver seamless knowledge transfer capacity to local service providers and conduct policy-relevant research could be considerably stronger. A ready market for bilingual education at Masters and PhD levels, part-time options, and continuing professional development also exists here in the nation's capital.

In response, the Institute embarked this year upon its journey of renewal under the framework of *Vision 2010*. These deliberations will conclude with the submission of a strategic plan at the end of August. The College of Principal Scientists has committed to three research foci determined through a comprehensive process of consultation; a collaborative deliberation to integrate the PhD in Population Health within the Institute and implementation of a governance model that strengthens the Institute's ability to facilitate inter-disciplinarity and respond adroitly to future opportunities for transformation.

As Principal Scientists hold multiple affiliations, it is vital to thank their 'home' Faculties for their willing and substantive support of the aims of the IPH/IRSP. This Annual Report presents the output of those 26 Principal Scientists as of August 2006.

Every Principal Scientist has prepared a full appendix further describing their accomplishments between May 1, 2005 and June 30, 2006, including their individual highlights of the year as well as the “value-add” that IPH/IRSP brings to their research. Part 2: Description of the most important scholarly activities undertaken during the preceding year

Mission

The mission of the Institute of Population Health is to build an academic program of excellence in population health research and training, and to play a leadership role in developing effective population health strategies and policies in Canada. Working with its partners, the ultimate goal of the Institute is to contribute to enhancing the health status of the Canadian population.

Objectives

- To build a strong scientific foundation for population health in the areas of risk assessment, intervention design, policy formation and global health;
- To offer world-class transdisciplinary training programs for those who are designing, implementing and evaluating population health initiatives;
- To inform the development of evidence-based population health policy in Canada and at a global level.

During this year, strategic planning has sought particularly to address crucial challenges identified by an External Strategic Review in 2004, namely:

1. *Focusing of science programs to ensure appropriate depth, breadth and impact and identification of research gaps;*
2. *Strengthening transdisciplinarity, global linkages and innovation;*
3. *Ensuring the ability to co-locate scientists with adequate resources;*
4. *Managing rapid growth and recruitment;*
5. *Ensuring a dedicated infrastructure to support growth and innovation;*
6. *Refining the scientific signature of the Institute.*

Throughout this year (2005/2006), IPH/IRSP continued its emphasis on developing a strong base of population health evidence with research programs elucidating the determinants of health through to health and medical intervention trials and health impact evaluation. Among the determinants of health examined over the past year were environmental and social risks, social inclusion, social capital, inequities, mental illness, homelessness, minority francophone status, obesity, food insecurity, youth risk and resilience, aboriginal status, globalization, genomics, psychosocial perception, crisis management, preparedness for terrorism and pandemics, gender, and disease, such as HIV/AIDS. Tools were developed for studying health impact through systematic review, health measurement techniques, burden of disease modeling and for knowledge translation and uptake. A focus on interventions yielded new evidence about the impact of new tools in medical decision support, multi-level targeted interventions and primary care reforms as well as best practice guidelines, health economic and policy reform and community initiatives.

Training

IPH/IRSP supports the interdisciplinary PhD in Population Health currently administered through the Faculty of Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies. Doug Angus, Director of Population Health PhD programs, continued in this central role until June 2006, supported by Roseline Savage. In 2005/2006, at least 50% of IPH/IRSP Principal Scientists contributed to full course instruction or lectures to students at the University of Ottawa in the field of Population Health.

The PhD in Population Health 2005 cohort commenced in September with 11 students. We expect to welcome 13 new students (to be confirmed in September 2006) in the fall of 2006. In addition to the Ph.D. in Population Health program, the IPH/IRSP is linked to the Graduate Diploma in Health Services and Policy Research program (11 current students) and the Graduate Certificate in Population Health Risk Assessment and Management (9 current students). The IPH/IRSP also shares links with the 3-month summer research internships undertaken yearly to build research capacity in community health (in 2005, 25 interns and 5 postdoctoral fellows). These internships are offered by Nancy Edwards, CHSRF/CIHR Nursing Chair. Our commitment to Aboriginal Health continues to be realized through Masters and PhD training support offered through CIET (*Anisnawbe Kekendazone*), a non-governmental organization whose staff are housed at 1 Stewart Street.

Seminars and Conferences

IPH/IRSP's profile has been raised through our series of well-attended scientific events, including a meeting of the World Health Organization Commission on the Social Determinants of Health held in February 2006 to discuss the impact of Globalization on Health, attended by some 25 international experts in the field and the World Health Organization Risk Assessment and Management symposium on the precautionary principle in July 2005, with 125 guests. IPH/IRSP continued its weekly Population Health Seminar Series co-hosted monthly with the Public Health Agency of Canada. This series welcomed notable speakers such as Recipient of the 2005 CPHA National Public Hero Award and Public Health Reporter for the Globe & Mail, André Picard; Commissioner of the Public Commission of Canada, David Zussman; and Chair of the Department of Public Health Sciences at the University of Toronto, Harvey Skinner. A slate of supplementary seminars accommodated short-term visits by Canada Research Chair candidates, Visiting Professors and other visiting researchers, including the Advisor and Gender Section Head of the Commonwealth Secretariat and researchers from Queen Mary University of London and Georgetown University School of Medicine in Washington DC. We held a memorable and light hearted joint Holiday Debate with Health Canada and the Public Health Agency of Canada discussing the merits of whether or not work is good for the health. Kevin Brand deserves particular recognition again this year for his efforts in organising our seminars as Chair of the Seminars Sub Committee for the College of Principal Scientists.

Research funding

People:

In 2005/2006, IPH/IRSP welcomed news of the appointment of Denise Spitzer and Jeanette Ward as Canada Research Chairs. Denise Spitzer is a Tier 2 CRC in Gender, Migration, and Health. Jeanette Ward is a Tier 1 CRC in Policy Implementation in Population Health. This brings the total number of CRCs in Population Health at the University of Ottawa to nine, representing 18% of the currently appointed CRCs at the University of Ottawa. Both candidates were awarded CRC-linked CFI and province of Ontario funding. Both also bring exceptional capacity for innovation and interdisciplinary in population health research.

Project and program grants:

Institute of Population Health Principal Scientist success with new Tri-Council grants yielded \$2,484,950 in new yearly Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR) funding and \$139,396 in new yearly Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC) funding. Other funding sources yielded an additional \$13,549,174 in new yearly funding in 2005/2006. These totals reflect the funded research projects for which an IPH/IRSP Principal Scientist was Co-Principal Investigator or Sole Principal Investigator.

In addition to Tri-Council funding, IPH/IRSP Principal Scientists were highly successful in obtaining substantial contract and research grants from Health Canada, the Public Health Agency of Canada, Industry Canada, the Department of Fisheries and Oceans, the CBRN Research and Technology Initiative (CRTI), the Canadian Health Services Research Foundation (CHSRF), Environment Canada, Defense Research and Development Canada (DRDC), the Ontario Ministry of Health and Long Term Care (MOHLTC), the Canadian Coordinating Office for Health Technology Assessment (CCOHTA), the Ontario Women's Health Council, the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO), the World Health Organization (WHO), Fondation Chagnon, the United States Agency for International Development (USAID), the International Development Research Centre (IDRC), the Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHA), the Saskatchewan Health Research Foundation (SHRF), the International Aluminum Institute, the American Cancer Chemistry, the City of Ottawa, the Ontario Children's Aid Society, and the Primary Health Care Transition Fund (PHCTF).

Publications

2005/2006 was another productive year for scholarly output by Principal Scientists.

Among the high-impact journals in which our Principal Scientists published in the 2005/2006 year were included in *The Lancet* (n = 3); the *Annals of Internal Medicine* (n = 1); and the *British Medical Journal* (n = 2). Over 250 peer-reviewed papers were published overall. In addition to an impressive publication record, IPH/IRSP Principal Scientists contributed their time and expertise to journals as editors, consultants and peer reviewers. Peter Tugwell continued his role as North American Editor of

the *Journal of Clinical Epidemiology* and Amir Attaran in his as editorial consultant for *The Lancet*. Peter Tugwell also continued his role as co-convenor for the *British Medical Journal (BMJ)* and *The Lancet* with particular focus on integration initiatives at the University of Ottawa. Ron Labonte is also the North American Associate Editor for *Critical Public Health*. Bill Hogg is a reviewer for the *Medical Journal of Australia* as well as the *Health Research Journal*. Tim Aubry served as Senior English Editor of the *Canadian Journal of Community Mental Health*, and Ted Schrecker serves on the editorial board. Dan Krewski is Chair of the US National Research Council Committee on Toxicity Testing for and Environmental Agents.

All publications appear at the end of this Annual Report.

Research policy, knowledge transfer and peer review

Through its Principal Scientists, IPH/IRSP continues to contribute to strategic research policy formulation, peer review and health policy evaluation at local, provincial, federal and international levels. Nancy Edwards was reappointed member of the Canadian Institute of Health Research (CIHR) Governing Council. Tim Aubry participated as an external reviewer for the Community Support Research Unit, Centre for Addictions and Mental Health in March 2006. Both Bob Flynn and Louise Bouchard served as reviewers for the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council. Jeremy Grimshaw continued in his role a Member of the CIHR Institute Advisory Board (IAB) for the Institute for Health Services and Policy Research. Julian Little participated as an external reviewer for the Medical Research Council in the UK and the Michael Smith Foundation for Health Research (BC). Peter Tugwell continued to serve on the Board of Trustees for the International Centre for Diarrhoeal Disease Research in Bangladesh. Brenda Wilson also served as a project reviewer for the UK NHS Health Technology Assessment program. Jeremy Grimshaw continued as a member on the Gardner Prize Medical Review Panel. Lise Dubois continued as a member of the management board for the new Carleton, Ottawa, Outaouais Local Data Research Centre (COOL RDC). Our Principal Scientists also contribute to peer review panels for CIHR (operating and strategic initiatives), provincial government funding schemes, and the Canada Research Chairs College.

Knowledge transfer spans contributions to policy, legislation and advisory and guidelines committees. In 2005/2006, interchanges and innovative arrangements between government, non-government organisations and IPH/IRSP continued. Principal Scientists have accepted invitations to present at various prestigious international and national forums and conferences. IPH/IRSP Principal Scientists have appointments as journal editors, editorial consultants and peer reviewers for journals including *The Lancet*, *British Medical Journal*, and the *Annals of Internal Medicine*. Peer-review was also undertaken for such journals as the *Canadian Medical Association Journal*, the *Journal of Epidemiology and Community Health*, the *Journal of the American Medical Informatics Association*, *Journal of the American Medical Association*, *Journal of Clinical Epidemiology*, *Canadian Family Physician*, the *Journal of International Migration and Integration*, *Critical Public Health*, *International Journal of Aging and Human Development*, the *Medical Journal of Australia*, *Social Science and Medicine*, *Health Promotion International*, and the *Health Research Journal*.

The offices for the recently re-funded Canadian Cochrane Network and Centre directed by Jeremy Grimshaw are now located at 1 Stewart Street. This is the Canadian pillar of the renowned international Cochrane Collaboration (www.cochrane.org) which provides reliable and up-to-date systematic reviews of health care interventions and promotes reliable searching and synthesis of evidence. A new Executive Director, MaryEllen Schaafsma, was appointed earlier in 2006. This year, our Principal Scientists contributed 6 Cochrane reviews to the *Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews* and one further non-Cochrane systematic review was accepted to *The Cochrane Library*. Peter Tugwell also co-convened the Cochrane Equity Field and Campbell Equity Methods Group this year.

Awards

In 2005/2006, Principal Scientists were recognized for research excellence and innovation. As part of National Nursing Week, the mayor of Ottawa, Bob Chiarelli, honoured Nancy Edwards by declaring May 10, 2006 “Nancy Edwards Day” in Ottawa. Kevin Brand received the REAP award (Research Excellence Award Program, U of O) from the School of Management for a paper on Approximations and Heuristics which was published in *Risk Analysis* (2005). Bob Flynn received the OACAS Outstanding Leadership in Child Welfare Award presented by the Ontario Association of Children’s Aid Societies for leadership in the development and implementation of the Ontario Looking After Children program for assessing the needs and monitoring the outcomes of young people in out-of-home care. Annette O’Connor was elected as a Fellow to the Canadian Academy of Health Sciences, recognizing her accomplishment in advancing academic health sciences. Kevin Pottie was elected as Fellow to the College of Family Physicians of Canada, recognizing his significant contributions to the discipline of family medicine. Kevin also received the Commitment to Care Award, presented from the Journal Pharmacy Practice for exceptional collaborative efforts to improve patient care. Louise Lemyre was elected Member of the Royal Society of Canada, Academy of Social Sciences. Dan Krewski was named the Inaugural American Industrial Health Council Visiting Scholar. Also in 2006, Robert Hawes, a doctoral student in the Population Health PhD Program, was named as a recipient of the Governor General’s Academic Gold Medal. The Gold Medal recognizes academic excellence at the graduate level, and is the most prestigious award that a Canadian student can receive.
